

### What is the Collegiate Academy?

Dual Enrollment in the Collegiate Academy is an accelerated mechanism through which an eligible Collegiate Academy Student may enroll on a full-time basis in FGCU courses that are creditable toward the high school diploma and an Associate of Arts degree.

Coursework may be taught by FGCU faculty or qualified Gateway High School teachers, and may be offered at the high school or on the FGCU campus during the spring and fall semesters.

Upon successful completion of the program, with proper application, students will be accepted into the University and be afforded an opportunity to apply for an FGCU scholarship.

Students who complete requirements of the Associate of Arts degree at the time of high school graduation through the Collegiate Academy, and who subsequently enroll at FGCU following high school graduation will be awarded an Associate of Arts degree by the University.

## GATEWAY COLLEGIATE ACADEMY

### Eligibility Requirements

**When applying for the Collegiate Academy (prior to the beginning of the 11th grade year), students must:**

- Have successfully completed four (4) semesters of high-school level Collegiate Academy course requirements in the 9th and 10th grade
- Have a minimum of 3.7 weighted and minimum of 3.0 un-weighted high school grade point average by the end of the 10<sup>th</sup> grade
- Have not completed sufficient units to qualify for high school graduation and must apply all credits earned to meeting high school graduation requirements and University criteria
- Have approval of the high school Principal (or designee) as to eligibility
- Have a satisfactory high school conduct and attendance record
- Have achieved minimum scores on the ACT or SAT by May 1st of the 10th grade year

English score: 20 or above  
Reading score: 20 or above  
Math score: 20 or above

#### SAT

Total Score: 1140 or above  
Evidence-based Reading and Writing:  
500 or above  
Math score: 500 or above

Writing & Language Test: 25 or above

## College Expectations

- Any letter grade below a "C" will not count as credit toward satisfaction of the requirements. However, all grades will be calculated in Student's GPA and will appear on their college transcript.
- Collegiate Academy Students must maintain a minimum 3.0 unweighted high school GPA and a cumulative FGCU GPA of 2.5. A Student who does not achieve minimum academic progress will be placed on Academic Warning/Probation. If the minimum GPA is not met the subsequent semester after probation the Student will be ineligible to continue Dual Enrollment.
- A Collegiate Academy Student shall adhere to the rules, guidelines and expectations stated in the FGCU Student Code of Conduct.
- A Student may lose the opportunity to participate in the Collegiate Academy program if the Student violates the FGCU Student Code of Conduct.
- While appropriate for college-level material, course materials and class discussions may reflect topics not typically included in secondary courses. Courses will not be modified to accommodate variation in student age and/or maturity.

## Earning an AA Degree

AA degrees can be issued to students that choose to remain at FGCU for at least the fall semester following high school graduation. All students that complete the General Education Program will have the "General Education Met" stamp applied to their official FGCU transcript at the end of 12<sup>th</sup> grade.

### AA Requirements:

- 60 earned credits
- General Education Program complete (36 credits and all categories fulfilled)
- College Level Writing Skills requirement complete – 12 credits total
- Intercultural Knowledge requirement complete – 6 credits total
- Satisfy Civic Literacy Requirement
- Satisfy Foreign Language requirement
