Final Exam Information

- All courses will have a semester exam or project except US History, Algebra, Geometry, Biology, and AICE Classes
- Exams count for 20% of student's overall semester grade
- Exams may not be taken early. Students who do not take their semester exam will be issued a zero, which will reflect on their report card.





Cambridge testing begins Monday, April 24th. Please try to keep extra activities and obligations to a minimum, as your student will be very focused on these exams. They need plenty of rest during this time and to eat healthy meals.

There are no makeup dates for these exams. If your student misses an exam, they cannot make it up until the next testing series, which will be in November. This is a Cambridge International rule.

Some Cambridge teachers are offering **after-school study sessions** to prepare for the exams. An updated schedule is posted in the GHS Cambridge google classroom your student can access.

Back on Track: Retaking a required failed class

We are offering students the opportunity to re-take a required graduation course for credit or to improve their GPA. Students who successfully complete and pass the course in credit retrieval can replace their previous failing or D grade to earn credit in the course and increase their GPA. In order to participate in this opportunity, students must attend at least two of the following credit retrieval sessions each week. It is highly recommended students create a consistent weekly schedule. This helps the student with time management and helps the credit retrieval teacher better understand the student's academic needs.

Please note, earning credits and GPA are different in high school than in middle school. Students MUST retake a failed course in order to receive credit for the course and increase their GPA.


