# **NEW Focus Attendance** feature in the **Parent Portal**

Parents can now upload attendance notes directly into Focus! This new process allows us to update student excused absences

### Uploading an Excuse Note in Focus Parent Portal Excuse notes must be turned in within 1 week of the first day back from absence

Attendance is important and matters for all our scholars at Gateway High School. Please be sure that, as a parent, you have created and logged in to your FOCUS Parent Portal. The FOCUS Parent Portal will allow you to monitor your child's attendance and upload excuse notes directly to FOCUS. The School Board considers the following factors to be reasonable excuses for time missed at school:

- Personal illness of the student (medical evidence required for absences exceeding five (5) days).
- Court appearance of the student.
- Medical appointment of the student (Doctor note required). C.
- D. Approved school activity.
- Death in the immediate family. E.
- Other absences with prior approval of the principal or designee.

Absences not included in excused absences listed above shall be unexcused.


# Make-Up Work for Absences



# What are the additional graduation options for students with disabilities?

Two additional options are available only to students with disabilities. Both allow students to substitute a CTE course with related content for one credit in ELA 4, mathematics, science and social studies (excluding Algebra 1, Geometry, Biology 1 and U.S. History). The two options are as follows:

- Students with significant cognitive disabilities may earn credits via access courses and be assessed via an alternate assessment. Students who choose the academic and employment option must earn at least 0.5 credit

#### What is the CAP?

The CAP allows a student to earn high school credit if the student passes an AP examination, a College Level Examination Program (CLEP) or a statewide course assessment without enrollment in the course.

#### State University System (SUS)

Admission into Florida's public universities is competitive Prospective students should complete a rigorous course study in high school and apply to more than one universit to increase their chance for acceptance. To qualify to ente one of Florida's public universities, a first time-in-colleg student must meet the following minimum requirement (credit eamed by industry certification does not count fo SUS admission):

### The Florida College System

The 28 colleges of the Florida College System serve nearly 800,000 students. Colleges offer affordable and stackable workforce credentials including certificate programs, associate in science degrees and associate in arts degrees, which in science degrees and associate in arts degrees, which transfer to a bachelor's degree program. Many colleges also offer workforce bachelor's degree programs in areas of high demand. All Florida. College System institutions have open-door admissions for students who earned a standard high school diploma or an equivalent diploma or successfully earned college credit.

Florida also offers students 49 accredited career and technical colleges or centers throughout the state, which provide the education and certification necessary to work in a particular career or technical field. Programs are flexible for students and provide industry-specific education and training for a wide variety of occupations.


