


Make-Up Work for Absences

Excused Absences: Make-up work for credit and grade is allowed for all <u>excused</u> absences. Immediately upon return to school, the student will be given the number of days absent plus one additional day to make up all work missed. Unexcused Absences: Students will not be eligible to make-up work for an unexcused absence.


Registration is ongoing throughout the school year.

# Launch of the 2024–25 FAFSA® Form

There are major changes and improvements coming to the 2024–25 *Free Application for Federal Student Aid* (FAFSA<sup>\*</sup>) form. As a result, the new form will be available in December 2023, not Oct. 1

The launch date will apply only for the 2024–25 FAFSA form. The changes to the FAFSA form for the 2024–25 aid year include

- expanded eligibility for federal student aid and
- a more streamlined application process.



# **COLLEGE ADMISSIONS**

Has your child completed college applications or plan to? Many Florida Universities have deadlines quickly approaching. Check the website for each university you are interested in to be sure you meet the deadlines. Below are some common terms used when discussing college applications.

- Early Decisions-Early decision is a binding commitment, meaning those who apply in this round must attend the selected college if they are accepted. You can only apply to one school early decision because of that binding commitment.
- **Early action** which has either a November or December deadline is similar to early decision without the binding agreement.
- **Rolling admission** means colleges review applications as they're sent in; there is no hard deadline by which you need to submit your application.
- **Regular Decision** means you are not applying in the early round, and you will receive your admission decision in the spring usually around late-March into early-April.

Advantages to applying early action include: You can apply for non-binding early action at multiple schools (as long as their stated policies allow it). You'll find out if you got accepted sooner than those who apply in the regular decision round.

### Seniors!

If you plan to apply to a university, please check your application deadlines. Some have a November 1<sup>st</sup> deadline. The best way to apply to multiple universities at once is to go through Common App at <u>https://www.commonapp.org/</u>. If your college requires a counselor recommendation, please fill out the "brag sheet" in the Senior Google Classroom so we get to know you better. Please give us a one to two-week notice.

#### **READING AND STUDENT SUCCESS**

AICE courses and final exams require students to read, comprehend, think critically, and express themselves in written form. AICE scholars should read <u>at least an hour a day</u> or <u>one book per week</u> for success. This can include school work but should be in addition to anything they do during the school day. English Language scholars should be encouraged to read independently and include informational texts in addition to leisure reading. Reading an hour daily will increase reading comprehension, brain connectivity, vocabulary, and critical thinking skills. Students have access to a complete library on their Chromebooks using OverDrive.

#### ATTENDANCE AND STUDENT SUCCESS

Attendance is vital to student success as well. Our data shows that students who miss 20 classes a year are significantly less likely to pass the exams in the spring. That's 20 hours of instruction they are missing out on. Twenty absent days of school equates to a month out of school. Not only is it difficult to make up the missed instructional time, but students become stressed about completing their current assignments and the work they miss. Students who miss classwork with an unexcused absence may not be allowed to make up their missed work, impacting their grades significantly—attendance matters!

#### STUDY TABLES

Study tables will be moved from Tuesday to Thursday starting November 2nd. We will have study tables every Thursday except when faculty meet on the 2nd Thursday of the month. Students need to sign up for study tables by Tuesday of the week they plan to come- giving teachers time to plan and gather materials for those attending. Upon dismissal, students will report to the cafeteria, where a teacher will get them and bring them to the designated work room. Scholars need to have transportation home at 3:30.

#### **REGISTRATION FOR SPRING EXAMS**

Registration for spring testing will happen before Christmas break. Students currently enrolled in an AICE course will automatically be registered for the spring exam for that course. Any retakes will require students to complete the online registration form. Students should watch for that announcement after Thanksgiving in the Google Classroom.





Students who need transcripts for Universities or scholarship applications need to request them directly from Cambridge. The link can be found on our school website under the Cambridge tab. There you will find a link and our center number. Students will need to know their 4-digit Cambridge ID to log in. Starting October 27th, there will be a \$17 charge for each transcript payable through the website. Students will be able to track when their transcripts were received by the college.
