
Attendance reminders:




Back on Track Credit Recovery

Cambridge scholars will finish the curriculum for their courses in the 3rd quarter, and preparation for the spring testing session will begin. We will offer study tables 3 Thursdays a month starting January 18th, from 1:45-3:00. There are no **study tables** on the 2nd Thursday of the month when we have a faculty meeting. Students must sign up each week by Tuesday afternoon so teachers are prepared for the number of students they will have and specifics on what they want extra help on. The signup form is in the Google Classroom. Study tables will end at 3:00, and students must have a ride home at that time. There are other tutoring options available through Connect with Lee. This free online service for all students is available through Launchpad. Connect with Lee is staffed by Lee County educators who are experts on the curriculum.

integrity of the exams, everyone must complete the exam at the same time. Students who miss the exam must pay to retake it in the fall. The current fee is \$110 per course, but those prices are subject to change after the beginning of the year.

Attendance remains an imperative factor in the success of Cambridge courses. Data shows that students who miss more than 20 days of school will not be successful on final exams. Please ensure your scholar gets to school every day and arrives on time.

Finally, remember how essential **reading** is to student success. Cambridge students should read at least an hour a day outside of school.



AVID Class of 2024 has earned 1.3 million dollars in academic merit scholarships so far and we are continuing to receive new updates daily. Our goal was one million dollars and we have now set a new goal to earn 1 million dollars per semester for AVID Seniors. Currently students have received college acceptances from 24 colleges & universities. We are still waiting for acceptances from other universities, and enrollment to open for technical colleges.

Senior Exam Exemption

Seniors who meet the following criteria may be exempt from final exams:

- Student must have an A or B average in the class for second semester.
- Student must not be at risk of losing credit for the class for which the exam is being exempted.
- Student must have no external suspensions during semester 2.
- AICE, Dual Enrollment, PERT, and EOC exams must be administered. No
 exemptions can be given for these exams.
- When an exam is waived, the two nine-week grades for second semester will be averaged to obtain a semester average for the course.
- Only those seniors who meet the criteria as stated above will be exempt from exams at the end of second semester.
