
Back on Track Credit Recovery

Cambridge exams begin April 25th and continue through the entire month of May. Your scholar should know when their exams are, and the dates are also posted on the school website. There are no makeup dates for testing. The only chance for retakes is in the fall, and it will be at the student's expense of \$110 per exam. Cambridge sets the time and dates of the exams, and we are not allowed to deviate from their schedule. Exam time will be a stressful time for your scholar. Please help them get to bed early, eat a good breakfast, and come to school prepared. Expect them to be mentally and emotionally tired during this time. This is like finals week in college—only it lasts several weeks. In addition to Cambridge testing, they may also be completing some state testing so be prepared for that as well.



Study tables begin at 1:45 and run until 3:00. Students can come for all or part of the session and choose the nights that work for them. They do need to sign up by Tuesday to reserve a spot. This ensures there will be someone there to work with them, and materials are prepared for what students need help with. Students must have a way home at 3:00 when study time is over.

Senior Exam Exemption

Seniors who meet the following criteria may be exempt from final exams:

- Student must have an A or B average in the class for second semester.
- Student must not be at risk of losing credit for the class for which the exam is being exempted.
- Student must have no external suspensions during semester 2.
- AICE, Dual Enrollment, PERT, and EOC exams must be administered. No exemptions can be given for these exams.
- When an exam is waived, the two nine-week grades for second semester will be averaged to obtain a semester average for the course.
- Only those seniors who meet the criteria as stated above will be exempt from exams at the end of second semester.
